John 4:1-42

What do you consider to be the characteristics of "Good Conversation"?

READ JOHN 4:1-6

What is the significance in the statement "Jesus had to travel through Samaria"? As a refresher -- In the lens of the Jewish people, who are Samaritans? Who are Samaritans, and where is Samaria for Christ's followers today?

READ JOHN 4:7-15

How does Jesus open the conversation with the Samaritan woman? How are we able to find common ground with lost people? How does Jesus use this common ground to turn the conversation to the Gospel? What practical things can we take away from this passage to begin to turn normal conversation into Gospel conversation?

READ JOHN 4:16-26

In this section, Jesus begins to confront the sin in the woman's life. Jesus, being God, has omniscient (all knowing) power. As humans, how are we to bring about the idea of sin and our inherent separation from God in conversation? There is an unapologetic sense of truth here. Is Jesus too harsh? Are we afraid of appearing harsh or scaring people off with the truth?
