V.9-12

V.13-16

God brings judgement down upon Israel for their sin. How do we see both His justice and mercy in play here? What does God's justice include for Israel? As a follower of Jesus Christ, how are my sinful actions impacting the Gospel & reflecting on God?

V.7:1-7

What can we learn about our own response to sin from Micah's grief in this passage? What is your experience with "Lamenting" something? What parallels do we see in God's accusations against Israel with today? How does Micah's response inform our own? What three things that we see Micah do should we practice in our own lives? How do we practically implement them?
