## **The Trailhead:**

Where is your “happy place”? If you could go and spend time anywhere in the world with no stress or concern, where would it be and why?

## **Discussion:**

### **v.17-29**

How did Ahab and Jezebel each contribute to the sin of Naboth’s murder? In what ways does Ahab’s behavior reflect spiritual hypocrisy—knowing God yet living in unrepentant sin?

How do vv.17–26 display both God’s justice and His holiness? Give specific examples from the text. 6. Why is it important that prophets (and Christians) speak uncompromised truth, even when it is risky or unpopular?

How can we tell if repentance (like Ahab’s) is genuine or performative? What does God’s response to Ahab tell you about his repentance? How can we be sure that our own repentance is genuine? What areas of your life might you be falling in to the same trap as Ahab, knowing truth but compromising to sinful desire?

How can we lovingly confront someone in unrepentant rebellion while honoring God’s justice and mercy? What practical steps or safeguards should be used? Why does it seem that Elijah uses very little grace in his approach to Ahab? Was this right or wrong? What makes Ahab different from other ungodly Kings?
